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## ABA in the Classroom: The WHAT? The HOW? The WHY?

Research has demonstrated that the application of the principles of Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) can be applied effectively within classroom settings to teach language and other important skills to children with Autism Spectrum Disorders and other developmental disabilities.

Specifically, this workshop will assist teachers in planning authentic and meaningful classroom experiences based on the science of human behavior. Participants will be introduced to scientifically based principles, procedures and instructional recommendations that help educators to:

- understand how ASD affects learning;
- become familiar with both myths and facts surrounding ABA;
- identify the principles of human learning;
- implement ABA procedures for increasing, generalizing and maintaining skills;
- implement ABA procedures for decreasing problem behaviors;
- develop data collection procedures for tracking progress.

Deb Booth, M.Ed., has over 18 years of experience working with individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders and similar learning challenges.
