About TEACH SOCIAL



“Social skills are the skills that enable a person to interact and communicate with others in a meaningful way. Social skills are closely allied to Emotional intelligence (EI) - a kind of intelligence or skill that involves the ability to perceive, assess and positively influence one’s own and other people’s emotions. In order to interact effectively with others, one has to be able to monitor and control one’s own emotional state.”

More simply stated, having good social skills means that individuals share their space with others effectively.

This hands-on/interactive workshop will provide participants with a basis for understanding social cognitive deficits and the challenges they present. Participants will gain insight into “social thinking” as described in the work of Michelle Garcia Winner and will explore available assessment tools and checklists to determine current levels of social functioning and to assist in the development and implementation of “social thinking” curriculum and IEP goals and objectives.

Who Should Attend?

Staff who are currently running social skills groups and/or are working with students on the Autism Spectrum or students with other social cognitive deficits. TEAMS ARE ENCOURAGED.

Deb Booth, M.Ed., has over 18 years of experience working with individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders and similar learning challenges. She has worked in residential, private, Collaborative and public school settings and has serviced children and their families through early intervention, home programming and consultation. Currently, Deb coordinates the Pilgrim Area Collaborative Extended Services (PACES) Program, which contracts with local school districts to provide direct home services to children, consultation to schools and families, assessments and evaluations and professional development.
