There are more than 500,000 children in this country diagnosed with some degree of autism, and that number keeps growing.

As more and more children are diagnosed with Autism, school districts are struggling to cope with their wide range of learning and behavioral challenges within the classroom setting. In accordance with state and federal law many public schools are currently working hard to train staff and provide comprehensive programs to educate children with ASD in the ‘least restrictive environment.’

This workshop will address theoretical perspectives of ASD as well as review current research on a broad range of treatment techniques. Participants will learn how to develop interventions that are responsive to the strengths and needs of individuals with ASD within the classroom setting.
